RESOLUTION DECLARING PHASE I: NOMINATION STUDY FOR THE NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF STATE BROWNFIELD OPPORTUNITY AREA PROGRAM COMPLETE AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF RENSSELAER PLANNING DEPARTMENT TO APPLY FOR DESIGNATION AS A NEW YORK STATE BROWNFIELD OPPORTUNITY AREA FOLLOWING A PUBLIC HEARING ON WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 1ST, 2021 AT 6:30 PM AT CITY HALL

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Resolution Authorizing the Mayor to Submit a Grant Application for the New York State Department of State Brownfield Opportunity Area Program (BOA), approved and adopted by the City of Rensselaer Common Council on February 15, 2017, a Draft Nomination Plan was prepared (a copy of which is available for review by the Public at the Office of the City Clerk during normal business hours), and same appears appropriate for approval, subject to a public hearing to be held on Wednesday, September 1st, 2021 at 6:30 pm at City Hall; and

WHEREAS, such work for the projects has been completed successfully according to the New York State Department of State Office of Planning, who recommends that the City Common Council accept such work and declare such Projects complete; and

WHEREAS, it also appearing appropriate that the City of Rensselaer Planning Department be authorized to submit an application to the New York State Department of State to become a designated Brownfield Opportunity Area in order to become eligible for Phase II and Phase III funding through the BOA program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as follows:

1. That the City Clerk give Notice of Public Hearing as set forth above, and that subject to such Public Hearing, said work detailed above be hereby accepted by the City, and Phase I be declared complete;

That subject to the Public Hearing, the City of Rensselaer Planning Department be authorized to submit an application to the New York State Department of State to become a designated Brownfield Opportunity Area in order to become eligible for Phase II and Phase III funding through the BOA program.

**A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF FIGHTING OVARIAN CANCER

WHEREAS, each year, approximately 21,980 women will be diagnosed with ovarian cancer, and roughly 14,000 women will succumb to this terrible affliction. RESOLVED, that the Common Council and the Mayor of the City of Rensselaer do support the “Turn the Towns Teal” campaign.

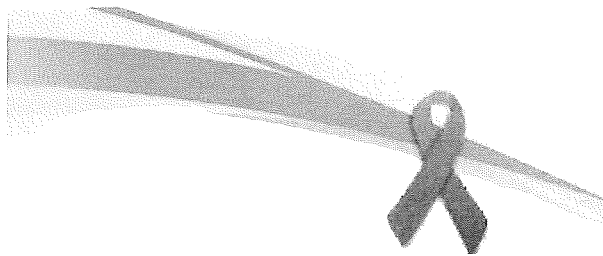
